## NEW BUSINESS

### 1. ASC: Virtual Forum and Evidence Requests

Danielle Fouquette, faculty chair of the Accreditation Steering Committee, shared about the upcoming accreditation virtual open forum that the College and the accreditation visiting team were hosting. The forum, to be held on March 11, is open to all students, staff, faculty and community members. Per recommendations from ACCJC, any managers below the Dean level are also invited to attend. The other managers will be able to participate in a separate meet and greet with the visiting team. The group also discussed that the accreditation visiting team provided the College with a list of additional evidence requests on March 1<sup>st</sup>, with a deadline to reply of March 8<sup>th</sup>. Requests for that evidence were sent out by members of the ASC early Monday morning.

During this discussion, an issue about campus emails was brought up. The email inviting the campus to attend this event was hidden in Outlook's "Other" inbox, which usually contains mass marketing emails, and is not regularly reviewed by some of the members. The Director of Campus Communications noted people's concerns but did state that the email had above average rates of engagement. The director of Academic Computing Technology shared that there is an option to remove the "Other" inbox from Outlook and would look into providing instructions/videos for the campus on how to remove that function.

### 2. PRPC: Annual Updates/Feedback and Suggestions

Co-chair of the Program Review and Planning Committee (PRPC), Bridget Kominek, shared that the committee was currently reviewing all resource requests that were submitted through the Annual Program Review Update (APRU) process. She also shared that the committee will be reviewing the current template and making changes during its April/May meetings in preparation for the fall 2024 process.

### 3. SEAC: Working with Associated Students

Student Equity and Achievement Committee (SEAC) faculty co-chair, Cynthia Guardado, shared that she attended an Associated Students meeting to discuss SEAC's current work. Cynthia encouraged chairs to attend meetings and share the results of their committee's work as it difficult for many students to attend committee meetings.

### 4. Vision Aligned Reporting

Daniel Berumen shared a quick presentation about the new Vision Aligned Reporting requirements from the California Community College Chancellor's Office (CCCCO). The reporting requirements affect a number of programs that receive categorical funds, including all Student Equity and Achievement funding. The new reports will require the College to provide student-level data on all interactions between these funding programs and students. They will also need to identify the costs/budget allocations made for those interactions.
