V. REPORT FROM FULLERTON COLLEGE PRESIDENT, DR. CYNTHIA OLIVO

On behalf of Dr. Olivio, Sonia De La Torre shared the following report:

VI. STANDING REPORTS

President's Report

Campus

 Friendly reminder that we have three Faculty Senate meetings in October and just one in November. In addition to today, we meet 10/30, 11/20, and 12/4. The 11/6 Faculty Senate meeting is cancelled so I can attend the statewide Academic Senate (ASCCC) Fall 2025 Plenary.

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• The Campus Budget Forum took place on 10/9. Please see the attached slideshow which goes into detail on important topics related to the district Resource Allocation Model (RAM), how enrollment trends impact our Student-Centered Funding Formula (SCFF) earnings, the \$127 million ending fund balance and the projects it is allocated to, the timeline for the campus budget development process, and key takeaways regarding the adopted 2025/2026 budget. If you have additional questions or suggestions for ways to educate the campus community about our budget and resource allocation processes, please share them with me or my co-chair of the Planning and Budget Steering Committee (PBSC), VPAS Henry Hua for discussion at our 11/5 meeting.

District

- Congratulations to Steven Estrada and Joel Salcedo for being elected as United
 Faculty president and vice president. I've met with them and discussed how our
 Senate can work with UF on <u>issues that cross Senate purview and union scope</u>, and I
 expect to agendize the academic calendar and changes to faculty evaluations
 responding to state legislation this semester. Steven has shared an <u>introductory</u>
 message that I'm happy to pass on. Please share with your constituents.
- <u>Sabbatical applications</u> are now open; the deadline to apply is November 1.
 Information can be found <u>in this presentation</u>. Gary Graves has created an <u>Alpowered assistant to help applicants</u>.
- At the <u>10/13 district Council on Budget and Facilities meeting</u>, **proposed changes to** the district's Resource Allocation Model were shared:
 - Establishing a district office with one manager and three staff members to support grants post-award accounting and reporting
 - Cost sharing for district positions that serve all campuses and district services: District Campus Safety, District Diversity, Culture, and Inclusion, Equal Employment Opportunity and Compliance, and Districtwide Staff Development
 - Establishing a contingency of 3% where campuses give a portion of their earnings to district services to cover the cost of Districtwide increases
 - Establishing the practice of any current year surpluses at District Services be reallocated to the three campuses based on the percentage of revenue each generates during the fiscal year

State

 On 10/10, I attended the statewide academic senate Area D meeting with colleagues from across the region. We got updates on statewide efforts and did a first read on resolutions

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- In November I will attend the statewide academic senate Fall 2025 Plenary where I will attend sessions on Senate leadership, attend the disciplines hearing to support the drone discipline proposal that our college seconded and the proposed changes to minimum qualifications for ASL. Check out the <u>draft resolutions</u> and share any input with me; I'll bring final versions to our 10/30 meeting to get direction for voting. Here are some topics in the current draft resolutions I think are relevant to our context:
 - Resisting federal cuts to grants for Minority-Serving Institutions and limits on DEIA efforts in higher education
 - Updating the ASCCC guide for effective curriculum approval processes and principles for faculty evaluation
 - Allowing for partial certification of Cal-GETC
 - Adopting a paper to clarify the role of the counseling discipline within the system
 - Resisting adoption of auto-billing programs for course materials
 - Ensuring consultation and transparency in technology procurement processes
- The <u>Faculty Association of California Community Colleges' 2026 Advocacy and Policy Conference is happening in February in Sacramento</u>. There's a call for proposals due on November 15. I encourage faculty to attend and propose sessions.

Treasurer's Report

Curriculum Chair Report

John Ison shared the following report:

Curriculum Development Reminders:

Starting this month, we focus on processing and approving curriculum for Fall 2027. We strongly recommend that faculty prelaunch Fall 2027 courses in October 2025 if they require approval from UC transfer and Cal-GETC.

Chancellor's Office Update re: Course Outline of Record (COR):

You may remember that, late in the fall semester of 2024, I presented the state's proposed Title 5 revised language concerning the published course outline of record. It has been made official.

I've provided Senators with chancellor's guidance memo ESS 25-66, which contains revisions to Title 5 sections 55001, 55001.5, 55002, and 55002.5.

The clock starts October 24. By April 22, 2026, new and revised course outlines being currently processed must implement the following changes:

• "Committees must adopt written procedures ensuring that every course outline describes approaches that will engage diverse student populations and advance equitable outcomes. Also, the committee ensures there is a process that reflects the principles of

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Universal Design for Learning (UDL), providing multiple means of representation, engagement, and expression" (ESS 25-66).

- A "strengthened and publicly accessible" COR containing the following elements (most of which we already include now): "title, catalog description, outcomes and objectives, units and hours (including contact hours, outside-of-class work, and total student learning hours), discipline assignment, and representative instructional materials. Notably, instructional materials should include consideration of open educational resources (OER) that meet accessibility standards. The COR must also provide representative descriptions of inclusive pedagogical approaches faculty may use to engage and support diverse learners" (ESS 25-66).
- For credit courses, learning must now be demonstrated through multiple, authentic means—including written work, projects, problem-solving, and skills demonstrations—ensuring that assessment reflects the diversity of students' learning styles and strengths. The regulation now requires CORs to include explicit accounting of instructional and outside-of-class hours, directly aligned to credit awards under section 55002.5. Importantly, updated language regarding "basic skills." For noncredit courses, the revised standards strengthen consistency by requiring CORs to specify subject matter, methodology, assignments or activities, and methods of evaluation, all taught by qualified instructors" (ESS 25-66).

The memo reminds us that every COR must be updated with these changes, and entered into the chancellor's office curriculum inventory, by Fall 2030.

Common Course Numbering (CCN) Update:

Phase 2B CCN templates have been published. 2B, along with Phase 3, will have an effective date of Fall 2027.

As I mentioned at the last Senate meeting, the state chancellor's office will allow us to update ADTs for CCN Phases 2 and 3 without submitting them to the state, if the CCN update is the only revision. Like we did in May of 2025, we'll sign a form to be sent to the chancellor's office.

Furthermore, departments wishing to employ the 4-digit numbering system when creating or revising courses should use the following for non-CCN courses: 1400-1999, 2400-2999, 3400-3999, and 4000-4999.

Other news:

The curriculum committee continues to discuss the following items:

- a recommendation for the lower-division GE pattern for the baccalaureate degree
- issues related to courses on the Associate GE pattern that were denied Cal-GETC approval
 - a strategy for implementation of Credit for Prior Learning
 - class size

Bepa Perez shared that AS is meeting with STEM faculty to discuss student concerns. They are hosting a Harvest Haunt on 29-Oct in the Campus Quad. Faculty interested in judging the Costume Contest should contact Bepa.

Credit for Prior Learning (CPL) catalog language

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M/S/U (Mangan/Kanal) to adopt the proposed Credit for Prior Learning (CPL) catalog language.

Interdisciplinary Studies Degrees

Creating a workgroup to explore INDS degrees in our students' experience was proposed as a first read. This item will be voted on at the 30-Oct meeting.

Fullerton College Mission Statement

A workgroup established in PAC is proposing that FC maintain its current mission statement. The mission statement is scheduled to be reviewed again by PAC in February 2026 as part of our regular process.

M/S/P (Mangan/Kanal) to direct that faculty representatives on PAC to support the workgroup's recommendation at the 10/22 PAC meeting.

AdFac

Naveen Kanal shared that he recently attended an American Federation of Teachers (AFT) conference. He discussed the importance of union members rallying against the erosion

Classified Senate

Matt Tribbe read a statement by <u>UF President, Steven Estrada</u>. Joel Salcedo shared that UF is working to fill seats on the Board and working on gaining access to necessary resources and tools since they were left with no documents, files or records.
